CRIMES REPORTED

Below is some of the crimes that have been reported for November 2023.

THE GLADE 02/11/2023 THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE

Van was broken into and two headlights were stolen, suspects drilled into the bonnet of the van in the process.

ORCHARD AVENUE 05/11/2023 THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE

Front and back license plates stolen from vehicle, no CCTV or suspects identified.

RIDGEMOUNT ROAD 05/11/2023 RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

Suspects broke into property and were believed to be looking for cash and high value jewellery although a lot of items were left on the scene.

KEMPTON WALK 06/11/2023 THEFT

Victim dropped phone whilst walking, when checked it was evident the phone had been picked up and was last tracked some distance away.

SHOREHAM CLOSE 16/11/2023 ROBBERY

Victim was delivering food believed to be a hoax call, when victim arrived at location three suspects appeared and committed a robbery of items meant for the delivery.

LONG LANE 20/11/2023 THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLE

Theft from a building site where suspects broke into location and stole a Digger used on the site.

ADVICE

With the run up to Christmas there is always an increase with thefts and robberies and more recently an increase of robberies where suspects are targeting school children in possession of Iphones, Any residents that have school children please advise them to keep phones hidden especially when leaving school and on the way home.

CCTV will also help investigations with theft from motor vehicles these can be as small as a well positioned ring doorbell or a dash cam and many newer vehicles have tracking abilities if there activated , this will help with any theft of motor vehicles.
